Suggested Participants - Age 3 to Primary 1

There are many different farm animals and this short story follows a sheep over the course of a year and shares what happens on a sheep farm over the seasons.

A SWAY story that can be projected onto a classroom whiteboard for a whole class experience.

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Lesson Plan (Early Level - Age 3 to Primary 1)

Introduction

- Share/discuss the learning intentions and success criteria.
- Request some wool.
- Meet a sheep using our 'Meet the sheep' worksheet. (The Meet the sheep worksheet is also available in Gaelic).
- <u>Take a virtual visit</u> to a farm and meet some sheep. (This video is also available in <u>Gaelic</u>)

Suggested discussion points

- Why do farmers keep sheep?
- What other animals live on the farm?
- Where do sheep live?
- What do sheep eat?

Learning

- **Literacy outcomes:** The ability to discuss why farmers keep sheep and the different jobs they do to look after them.
- **Drama outcomes:** The ability to use my voice, movement, and expression in role play.

Additional tasks

- Request an <u>Early Level Resource Box</u>. These boxes contain a range of resources like books, puppets, toys and costumes. These boxes can be booked out for use in nurseries and P1 & P2 for a set period of time.
- Check out our **Explore** and **Discover** with Farmer Lily pack.
- <u>Listen to a sheep</u> and use role play to act out how a sheep moves and sounds.
